The 1939 State High School Basketball Tournament was one of the most successful in the history of the 14-year old series.

Closer games, the largest attendance, and the highest amount of receipts marked the tournament held in Athens, March 9-10-11. Eatonton, Class "B" winners, won each of its three contests by a margin of three points or less. Some 7,500 fans witnessed the three-day stand of Georgia's best in high and junior high school basketball, and receipts were in excess of \$1,000.
