It's Important to Understand Out-of-Season Practice

GHSA By-law 2.69 (pages 67-68 of the Constitution & By-Laws) outlines acceptable and unacceptable practices for out-of-season participation. Additionally, there are “Interpretations” of that by-law on pages 76-79 of the White Book that provide realistic scenarios that have arisen in the past.

Questions have arisen about what constitutes skill-building drills. At any given point in time, one coach in a school's sports program may work with one or two athletes in drills designed to build individual skills. If two players are used, they may work together (i.e., pitcher and catcher in baseball) or they may work against each other (i.e., offensive and defensive player in basketball). **It is illegal for the two students to compete against one another as a form of try-out or to determine their ranking** (i.e., tennis or wrestling). It is also illegal for a coach to coach **any** athletes in the school's program on a non-school team during the school year.



The school year begins on the date of the earliest practice in any fall sport, and it ends on the last day of school for the students. During the summer months, the only restriction is that any participation in weight training, competitive leagues, camps, clinics, etc., must be voluntary.

SPORTS MEDICINE INFORMATION: The GHSA has received information from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) about the availability of a new multimedia educational (toolkit) initiative titled, “Heads Up: Concussion in High School Sports.” This initiative was developed by CDC, with the support of multiple partners and experts, to protect teen athletes from a serious, but often underestimated health threat – concussion.

The kit contains practical, easy-to-use information for high school coaches, as well as athletic directors and trainers, parents and teens, on how to prevent, recognize, and manage concussions. Items in the tool kit include: a video and DVD featuring a young athlete disabled by concussion, a wallet card and clip board sticker for coaches, posters, fact sheets for parents and athletes in English and Spanish, and a CD-ROM with downloadable kit materials and additional concussion-related resources.

ATTENTION: All Schools

There has been some confusion concerning the newly-approved **Basketball Scrimmage** rule that was passed by the State Executive Committee at the August, 2005 meeting.

This rule, which allows one (1) scrimmage within the seven days preceding the first game of the regular season on days other than Friday or Saturday, goes into effect **IMMEDIATELY**.

Basketball coach can, therefore, schedule these scrimmages prior to the upcoming (2005-06) basketball season under the following criteria:

a. The scrimmage will be a regulation-timed game for varsity teams only.

b. Officials will be paid for a crew-of-three at the regular season rate of pay.

c. Boys and girls teams may play a double-header, or play on different days.

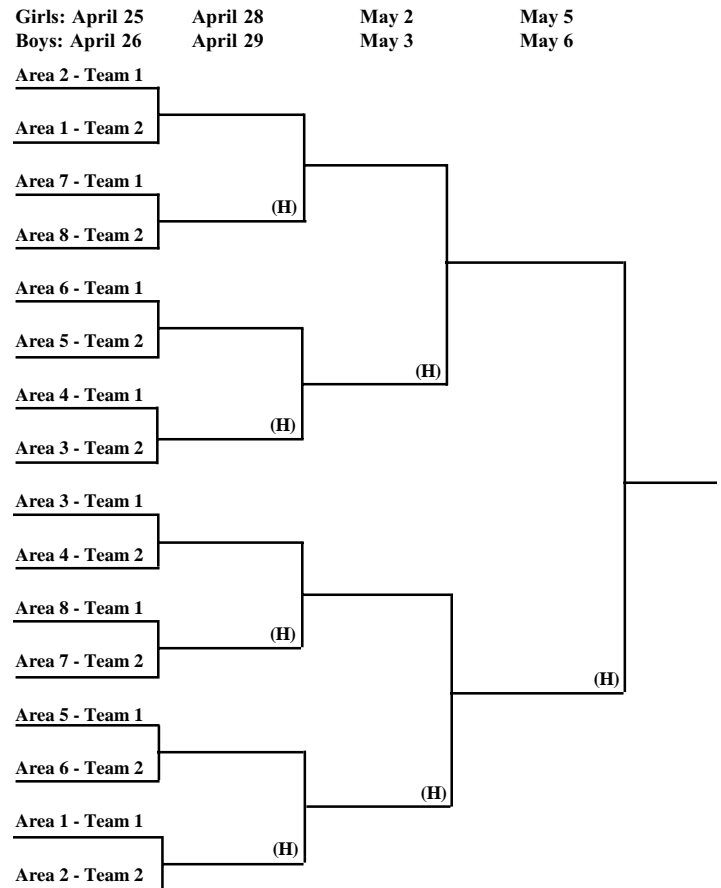
White Book Corrections

By-law 1.58 (page 35): There is a discrepancy between what is found in sections "b" and "d" with what is found in section "e." Section "e" is correct. The deadline for make up work or credit recovery work is the 14th day of the new semester. The student is ineligible in the new semester until the work is completed and the grade is assigned. There is also a typographical error in section "e." On the second line, "with" should read "within."

By-law 2.71c (page 68): The sports of Tennis and Golf are exceptions to the by-law requiring a game manager. That fact was omitted in this printing.

GHSA Officials / Coaches Clinics

By-Law #2.54, page 63 of the GHSA Constitution and By-Laws states: Every coach at a GHSA member school must attend a **GHSA-sponsored rules clinic** if he/she coaches the following sports: football, softball, volleyball, riflery, cheerleading (spirit and/or competitive), basketball, wrestling, swimming and diving, track, baseball, soccer and gymnastics.

- (a) A \$50.00 fine per coach who does not attend a clinic will be assessed to the school.
 (b) First-year community coaches are reminded that clinic attendance is mandatory for them, also.
