Look to the GHSA Web Site for Answers Later This Spring

The spring meeting of the GHSA Executive Committee was a time for many far-reaching decisions to be made affecting a variety of aspects of high school athletics in Georgia. Any time this many changes are made, there is a period of adjustment and many questions raised. The GHSA web site will feature several lists of "Frequently Asked Questions" throughout the spring. In this article, I want to highlight some of the changes that were made, and you can go to the GHSA web site to get more information.

Standardized Heat Policy: The three-year study on heat illness and football preseason practices produced a tremendous amount of data that applied to all GHSA sports. The "Institutional Heat Policy" (By-law 2.67) is a statewide mandate that applies to all sports in all seasons of the year. Additionally, there are new guidelines to regulate pre-season practice in football. Both of these policy changes reflect the best practices as put forth by several national organizations such as the American College of Sports Medicine and the National Athletic Trainers Association.

Emergency Action Plan: Many schools already have such a plan to handle natural emergencies, severe illness/injury, terroristic activity, etc. Those schools that do not have an "after 3:00" plan need to formulate such plan for both game venues and practice venues in all sports. There will be several "model plans" on the GHSA web site over the next few

all sports. There will be several "model plans" on the GHSA web site over the next few weeks. This is an important issue to safeguard the wellbeing of our students, coaches, and spectators.



Eligibility Rules: Several new rules were implemented as well as several clarifications of existing rules supplied. One of the biggest issues involves students being released after a minimum academic day to go to personal athletic practices. Since the State Board of Education standards prevent schools from conducting practices and regular season games during the school day, it was felt that these students had an unfair advantage over other students. Students are certainly free to continue this practice plan, but they will not be eligible to compete on a GHSA team in that sport.

Reclassification: Beginning with the 2012-13 school year, there will be six classifications in the GHSA. This expansion has produced some difficulty in those sports that have a centralized championship event. A number of changes will be made in calendar dates and format changes in several rounds of the playoffs. Be certain to look at the GHSA web site for more information on these changes.

Class A Playoff Structures: The decision to have separate championships for public schools and private schools in Class A resulted in many challenges. In a certain sports, the number of Class A schools participating made separate championship impractical. In other sports, the number of Class A school participating was such that separate championships will be held, but the schools will be placed in areas rather than regions for regular season competition. In Football, Softball, Basketball, and Baseball, there will be separate championships on a region basis. Teams will qualify for post-season play and will be seeded according to power ranking systems that have been developed. These power ranking systems will be found on the GHSA web site within the next few weeks.

But before we can implement all these new rules and procedures, we have lots of spring activities to complete. Best of luck in all those activities!

STATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE March 19, 2012

MINUTES

The semiannual meeting of the Executive Committee of the Georgia High School Association was called to order at 9:00 a.m. on March 19, 2012, at the Marriott City Center, Macon, Georgia, by Dr. Gary Holmes, President. Following is a **condensed** version of the minutes of that meeting. A complete version may be found on the GHSA web site (www.ghsa.net).

COMMITTEE REPORTS

BOARD OF TRUSTEES: Report presented by Wayne Tootle

The Committee recommended:

Approving the following Class A Championships Formats:

- (A) The following sports will NOT have separate championships for public and private schools due to the limited number of school competing: Volleyball, Wrestling, Swimming & Diving, Soccer, Lacrosse, Riflery, Gymnastics
- (B) The following sports will have separate championships for public and private schools and will use a power ranking system to qualify for the playoffs: Football, Softball, Basketball, Basketball
- (C) The following sports will have separate championships for public and private schools, but will be organized in an area format rather than a region format. Each area will organize and finance its competitions: Cross Country, Track & Field, Golf, Tennis, One Act Play, Literary (see Literary Committee for Areas). (Note: See Cheerleading Committee report for Cheerleading format.)

PRIVATE SCHOOL AREAS PUBLIC SCHOOL AREAS Region 3, 4, and 7 Regions 2A and 4 Area #1: Area #1: Region 8 Area #2: Regions 2B and 3 Area #2: Area #3: Region 5 Area #3: Region 1 Area #4: Region 6 Area #4: Region 5, 6, 7 and 8

Motion Passed (voice vote)

Revise By-Law 2.67 - "Practice Policy and Heat and Humidity" as follows:

Schools must follow the statewide policy for conducting practices and voluntary conditioning workouts in all sports during times of extremely high heat and/or humidity that will be signed by each head coach at the beginning of each season and distributed to all players and their parents or guardians. The policy shall follow modified guidelines of the American College of Sports Medicine in regard to:

- 1. The scheduling of practices at various heat/humidity levels
- The ratio of workout time to time allotted for rest and hydration at various heat/humidity levels
- 3. The heat/humidity level that will result in practice being terminated

A scientifically approved instrument that measures Wet Bulb Globe Temperature (WBGT) reading must be utilized at each practice to ensure that the written policy is being followed properly.

GUIDELINES FOR HYDRATION AND REST BREAKS

- 1. Rest time should involve both unlimited hydration intake (water or electrolyte drinks) and rest without any activity involved
- 2. For football, helmets should be removed during rest time
- 3. The site of the rest time should be a "cooling zone" and not in direct sunlight
- 4. When the WBGT reading is over 86:
 - a. ice towels and spray bottles filled with ice water should be available at the "cooling zone" to aid the cooling process
 - b. cold immersion tubs must be available for practices for the benefit of any player showing early signs of heat illness.

PENALTIES: Schools violating heat policy shall be fined a minimum of \$500.00 and a maximum of \$1,000.00.

Revise By-Law 1.43 (Line 2): Add the word "voluntary summer workouts" to "try-outs, practices, or games" in regard to the requirement to have an up-to-date physical form on file at the schools.

Revise By-Law 2.21: (Make the existing material sub-section "A" and add sub-section "B"): Each school shall have a written Emergency Action Plan for athletic practices and games. This plan must include responses to natural disasters, serious illnesses and injuries, and terroristic events and must have the involvement of local law enforcement agencies, rescue agencies, and medical doctors and hospitals. (Note: Model Emergency Action Plans will be available on the GHSA web site.)

BASEBALL COMMITTEE:

Rounds 1 and 2 will be played at the same time as other classifications; Semifinals - May 13 (DH); May 14 (if game);

Championships - May 18 (DH); May 20 (if game)

BASKETBALL COMMITTEE:

Report presented by Christian Suttle

The Committee recommended:

Third round playoff games will be held at the site of the higher seeded team.

- a. If the teams have the same seed, the site will be determined by a coin toss.
- b. Girls' teams will play on the first playing date, and the boys' teams will play on the second playing date.
- c. Financial procedures will be the same as the procedures used in the first two rounds.

Motion Passed (voice vote)

Semifinal games will be held separate from championship games.

- a. Semifinal games will be scheduled at seven centralized sites by classification.
- b. Championship games will be scheduled at a single site with four games on Thursday, four games on Friday, and six games on Saturday.
- c. Games days and times for the championship games will be determined by the Executive Director.

CHEERLEADING COMMITTEE:

Class A Postseason Plan:

All Class A schools will be allowed to enter the Sectional Tournaments held at a central site. Public and private schools will compete separately with 8 public teams and 8 private teams advancing to State Championships.

FOOTBALL COMMITTEE:

Report presented by Earl Etheridge

The Committee recommended:

FOOTBALL SECTION - Page 65 - D

Football Preseason Practice Regulations:

- Football practice <u>may</u> begin five consecutive weekdays prior to August 1.
 In the first five days of practice for any student, the practice shall not last longer than 2 hours, and the student shall wear no protective gear except for helmet and mouthpiece. Note: The time for a session shall be measured from the time the players report to the field until they leave the field.
- 2. Beginning August 1, any student <u>may</u> practice in full pads and may practice two times in a single calendar day under the following stipulations:
 - a. A student must have participated in five conditioning practices wearing no protective gear other than helmet and mouthpiece before being allowed to practice in full pads
 - b. If multiple workouts are held in a single day:
 - (1) No single session may last longer than 3 hours
 - (2) The total mount of time in the two practices shall not exceed 5 hours
 - (3) There must be at least a 3-hour time of rest between sessions
 - (4) There may not be consecutive days of two-a-day practices. All double-session days must be followed by a single-session day or a day off
 - c. These procedures are derived from recommendations created by the Inter-Association Task Force for Preseason Secondary School Athletics Participants in the research paper "Preseason Heat-Acclimatization Guidelines for Secondary School Athletics."

- 1. Class A schools will have a bye week the first round of the playoffs
- 2. All seven championship games will be played in the Georgia Dome: 3 on Friday; 4 on Saturday

Institute a Sectional Tournament before the State Tournament with the top four teams from each region participating as long as the teams meet a required team scoring standard.

The private schools areas are: Area #1: Regions 3, 4, and 7; Area #2: Region 5, 6 and 8
