Coaches Can ‘Win’ By Being Better Educators

Educators are uniquely positioned to touch the lives of people. However, it seems that we have to dig through a mountain of statistical data in order to find education these days. Educators are being given more responsibility than ever before; they are being held to higher levels of accountability than ever before – but I am convinced that Mark Hopkins’ definition of education given many years ago still holds true: **“Education is a teacher on one end of a log and a student on the other end.”** The knowledge base has multiplied exponentially over time, pedagogy has a never-ending cycle of fads, and demographics seem to be out of control, but educators have to connect with students.



Educators who coach are still primarily educators. The “classroom of the coach” offers many advantages over other classrooms, but it also has many challenges. Coaches must define their coaching role, and then commit themselves to it. Is your primary function to teach athletic techniques – or is there more? In order to fulfill the role properly, the coach must balance the competitive drive that is inherent within most coaches with the desire to touch lives of students effectively. There will be some (perhaps many) in your community who will judge your success solely by competitive victories. We must try to educate those people to a bigger view, or we will allow them to define the coaching role for us.

All educators must develop a philosophy of education, and coaches are no exception. Are you a Potter – who shapes lumps of clay into useful or beautiful objects? Are you a Gardener – who plants seeds, nurtures, and sometimes prunes living beings? It is OK to be a potter when it comes to teaching athletic techniques, but I think gardeners are more effective for teaching life-long lessons to students. The more you strengthen the lives of your athletes for the long-run, the more benefits accrue in the short-term to your team.

Team building is important to the development of the individual members as well as to the collective group. This begins by acquainting your athletes with their uniqueness and then convincing them to invest their uniqueness in group goals. When you are trying to be a winning coach and a coach who touches the lives of your athletes, remember the following general axioms:

- a. Talk often about the lifelong values that can be learned through athletic participation
- b. Explain to your athletes what you want and why you think that is important.
- c. When people know you care, they overlook a lot of your weaknesses

No matter how complicated the business of education may become, there will always be the important element of “touching a life in a meaningful way” that has to be considered. I hope that we can all work together for the benefit of our students in athletics and competitive activities.

GHSA SPORTSMANSHIP STATEMENT

Please insure that the following statement is read as a public address announcement prior to the start of **every GHSA sanctioned contest**:

"The GHSA and its member schools have made a commitment to promote good sportsmanship by student/athletes, coaches, and spectators at all GHSA sanctioned events. Profanity, degrading remarks, and intimidating actions directed at officials or competitors will not be tolerated, and are grounds for removal from the event site. Spectators are not allowed to enter the competition area during warm-ups or while the contest is being conducted. Thank you for your cooperation in the promotion of good sportsmanship at today's event."

ATTENTION: Football Coaches

With so many high school games now being televised, a reminder is necessary that use of video (including a TV monitor) during a game is prohibited by National Federation rules.

Rule 1, Section 6, Article 1 of the NFHS Football Rules states: "Electronic communication equipment, other than an audio tape recorder, including but not limited to computer, film, television and videotape or any type of still or moving pictures, shall not be used for coaching purposes during the game or between periods."

Please be aware that the interpretation of this rule has been made so that a coach watching a TV monitor or similar telecast of his own game while the game is going on would be in violation, and that team would be subject to fine and/or more severe penalties if reported to the GHSA office.

Scholar/Athlete and Scholar/Manager Awards Programs

The Scholar/Athlete Awards Program and the Whitey Zimmerman Scholarships Program will be in place again this year, sponsored by Chevron/Texaco, the Atlanta Falcons Youth Foundation, Gallagher Electric & Engineering Company, Inc., and the National Football Foundation & College Football Hall of Fame, Inc.

The awards' presentation will be held in conjunction with the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl luncheon on December 29, 2006. Honorees must commit to being present at the awards luncheon in order to receive their awards.

Nomination forms are provided online for both scholarships. Go to www.ghsa.net to download the forms. They must be completed and submitted to your Region

Secretary no later than November 1, 2006.

There will be 40 scholarships for Scholar/Athletes (one winner from each region) of \$1,000.00 each and the overall winner will receive an additional \$1,000.00 scholarship.

The winners will be selected on the basis of 40 percent academic achievement, 40 percent football achievement and 20 percent community leadership.

Each school may submit two senior **Athlete** nominees to their Region Secretary. The region will select the top two nominees to be submitted to the State Selection Committee.

An additional scholarship program has been made available to recognize outstanding Scholar/Managers with the

Whitey Zimmerman Scholarships.

There will be 12 winners selected (two from each classification and two at-large) with a \$1,000.00 scholarship going to each. The honorees will be selected on the basis of 40 percent academic achievement, 40 percent football managing achievement and 20 percent community leadership.

Each school may submit one senior **Manager** nominee to their Region Secretary and the region will then select the top nominee to be submitted to the State Selection Committee.

Final honorees will be notified by November 30, 2006 and will be expected to attend the awards luncheon on December 29, 2006.

- Have round-table discussion with students, officials and parents
- Donate sportsmanship-related book or video to library on behalf of officials
- Send certificates of recognition and appreciation letters to officials

Wednesday, Oct. 18

National Youth Health Awareness Day

- Offer pregame meal with nutritional analysis
- Hold workshops on health issues; recognize school nurse, trainer and team doctor
- Offer students opportunity to "shadow" health professionals
- Create and display bulletin boards and posters dealing with healthy life-style issues
- Have students prepare directory of community agencies
- Set aside part of practice to discuss healthy life-style issues

Thursday, Oct. 19

National Coaches / Sponsors / Advisors Day

- Host breakfast for all coaches and sponsors
- Ask non-coaching members of the faculty to be "coaches of the day"
- Honor different coaches and advisors each hour of the day

National Fan Appreciation Day

- Provide booster club members a coupon for free popcorn and soda
- Present free program to fans (based on school colors or other criteria)
- Give school shirts to most avid fans (students and adults)
- Offer tailgate party with refreshments
- Introduce parents of players and cheerleaders during pregame
- Ask media to feature fan with longest attendance record

National Community Service / Participation Day

- Offer free admission to event to representatives of program advertisers
- Hold open house; invite alumni, businesses and media to attend
- Do radio or television public service announcements with activities participants
- Offer "errand running" service for elderly
- Recognize business partners in programs

GHS A Officials / Coaches Clinics

By-Law #2.54, page 32 of the GHS A Constitution and By-Laws states: Every coach at a GHS A member school must attend a **GHS A-sponsored rules clinic** if he/she coaches the following sports: football, softball, volleyball, riflery, cheerleading (spirit and/or competitive), basketball, wrestling, swimming and diving, track, baseball, soccer and gymnastics.

- (a) A \$50.00 fine per coach who does not attend a clinic will be assessed to the school.
 (b) First-year community coaches are reminded that clinic attendance is mandatory for them, also.
