'New Guy' Won't Seek Change Just for Change's Sake

The winds of change have come to the Georgia High School Association. Subtle changes in long-term tenure began with the retirement of Joyce Kay. Mrs. Kay had been a primary fixture in the GHSA for more than 35 years.

Joyce's retirement was followed, shortly, by the retirement of Associate Director Dennis Payne, an 11-year administrator in football and baseball.

Ultimately, the retirement of Dr. Ralph Swearngin, Executive Director, swept in the changes you will see for this and the coming years. Dr. Swearngin served as the Commissioner of Officials for nine years and as the Executive Director for the next 13 years.

Other changes within the organization have come with the beginnings of this school year:

- Jay Russell, former Athletic Director at LaGrange High School has been named Assistant Executive Director. He will administer cross country, track and golf.
- Ernie Yarbrough has been named as Coordinator of Officiating. Additionally, he will administer softball, basketball and baseball; a change from prior years.
- Tommy Whittle, Associate Director, will administer soccer now along with his duties in football and literary events.
- Denis Tallini, a third year Associate Director, has been charged with the reorganization and revitalization of our Sports Medicine Advisory Committee.
- In addition, there are a total of 20 new members on the 2014-15 State Executive Committee out of the 58 representatives, bringing some new and fresh ideas to the GHSA's rule-making board.

Admittedly, these are not sweeping changes, but they are reflective of our approach through the change process. The Georgia High School Association has many long standing regulations and procedures that have served our schools well in past years.

It is our intent to continue on the course as designed by our predecessors, while being keenly aware of the changes and challenges facing our member schools. Throughout the transitions experienced in the past four months, our message has been consistent: The GHSA is and has been firmly grounded and it is this "new guy's" intentions to reflect the element of change, but not to seek changes for the sake of change.

First Power Ratings on September 9

The first power ratings for Class A football and softball by MaxPreps will be posted on GHSA.net on September 9. The power ratings will be updated each Tuesday after that for the remainder of the respective regular seasons.

Every GHSA member school **must** submit all game results, regardless of classification, to MaxPreps in order to manage the Class A football and softball power ratings and to verify Region Standings across all classifications.

MaxPreps offers coaches a stat management and communication platform that enables them to efficiently submit their schedules, scores, rosters and statistics.

Home 'Pink' is OK for September 8-13

In observance of breast cancer awareness week, the GHSA will allow schools to wear "pink" uniforms at their HOME events during the week of September 8-13 for ALL fall sports.

If a school does NOT have a home contest that week, it may request to wear pink at a home contest either the week prior to or the week following September 8-13. Schools should contact their GHSA sports coordinator with this request.

The home team must inform the visiting team that pink uniforms will be worn, and the visiting teams must wear their normal "dark" uniforms at these events.

GHSA Provides Catastrophic Coverage

A reminder from the Georgia High School Association that the GHSA provides Catastrophic Accident Medical Coverage to participants at all member schools.

Coverage is provided for students participating in interscholastic competition (governed by the regulations of the state high school athletic/activities authority), including school-supervised practice, tryouts, pre- and post-game related activities including award banquets and covered travel, as defined under the policy.

All student athletes, student managers, student trainers, student cheerleaders and students participating in interscholastic competition are eligible.

The GHSA Catastrophic coverage includes medical, disability, rehabilitative and custodial benefits per the policy. The policy carries a \$25,000 deductible for accident medical expenses.

Currently, the GHSA pays three-quarters of the policy premium for all member schools with the remainder coming from the school's dues.

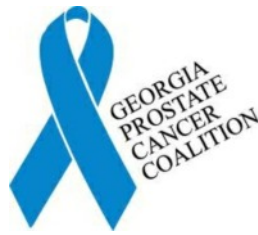
GHSA Approves 'Blue Week' to Fight Prostate Cancer

The GHSA has teamed up with the Georgia Prostate Cancer Coalition in an effort to reduce prostate cancer deaths in the state of Georgia.

"To promote prostate cancer awareness, the week of September 22-27 will be observed as 'Blue Week' throughout our member schools," said GHSA Executive Director, Gary Phillips.

All games played Friday, September 26, will be designated as 'Know Your Score Night' and will feature reminders for men to have prostate exams and blood tests to establish their PSA "score."

Officials will be using blue penalty flags, coaches on both sidelines will be wearing blue wristbands and players will wear symbolic blue ribbon helmets decals.



Georgia is No. 4 in the country in prostate cancer deaths. One in every six men (one in every four African-American men) will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in their lifetime.

"Georgia guys don't have to die," says Bill Buckley, GPCC board member and prostate cancer survivor. "We are convinced that as we increase awareness, we'll detect this cancer earlier and decrease deaths. We are very thankful that the GHSA has stepped up to help us in this statewide awareness effort."

Just as the GHSA observes "Pink Week" to promote breast cancer awareness, "Blue Week" will become an annual event each September during the seasons to come.

Board of Trustees

1. Proposal to delete By-Law 4.23 (e), Page 51; under Reclassification that reads as follows:
 - (e) Following the initial placement of schools into regions, each new region shall meet to audit the population numbers of its member schools.
 - (1) If the numbers are accurate, a written notice of approval shall be sent to the GHSA office.
 - (2) If there are discrepancies in the numbers, a written notice shall be sent to the GHSA office asking the Reclassification Committee to hear the appeal at the meeting that is scheduled to hear appeals of lateral transfers. [GHSA Office]
2. Proposal to allow coaches to work with three (3) athletes at any given time in out-of-season skill building drills. [Region 7-AAAAA]
3. Constitutional Amendment: Article IV - Section 8 (page 10):
 - A. Add: A President and a Vice President shall be elected as State Association officers at the spring meeting for a two (2)-year term after ratification of the reclassification plan. [GHSA office] **Note:** *this would be the first vote and will require two (2) votes.*
4. Proposal to approve the 2013-14 Audit Report. [GHSA Office]
5. Review of the Catastrophic Insurance premiums for 2014-2017. [GHSA Office]

6. Discussion of the possibility of changing the spring and fall meeting dates for the State Executive Committee for the year 2015-16. [GHSA Office]
7. Discussion of the possibility of changing the designation of the current regular season football week "0" to week "1" and thus allowing teams a full 12 weeks to schedule 10 games without restriction instead of the current 11 weeks. [GHSA Office]

Cheerleading Committee

1. Proposal to establish travel reimbursement for cheer officials for all associations. Questions to be considered include:
 - A. How much are officials paid per mile?
 - B. Would officials be paid one way or round trip?
 - C. How would officials be paid if they are not able to car pool? [GHSA Office]
2. Proposal to define/clarify By-Law 2.56 (page 35): Officials or an assignor of officials may not be a head coach or an assistant coach at a GHSA school in the same sport. [GHSA Office]

Eligibility Committee

1. Proposal to establish a deadline date for student transfers to or from a non-member school in the semester prior to the school becoming a GHSA member school. [GHSA Office]

Football Committee

1. Proposal to allow schools that have a scrimmage

game/games canceled or suspended due to inclement weather to have the following options:

- A. Play the game on another night during the calendar week that the game was missed. (GHSA rules define calendar week as Sunday to Saturday. Sunday competition is not allowed)
- B. Play the game during another week that you do not have another scrimmage or regular season game scheduled. No scrimmage game can be scheduled after the Saturday of "0" week.

If option #1 and # 2 above are not available:

- C. Play a controlled scrimmage where a specific number of plays are decided upon by the two schools and approved by the GHSA Office on a Monday prior to a Friday or Saturday scrimmage game. You may not have a scrimmage game or controlled scrimmage on the same calendar week of a regular season game. [GHSA Office]

2. Proposal to establish a deadline for applications for summer (contact) camps as follows:
All applications requesting permission for summer camps at GHSA schools or other facilities must be submitted by May 1. All subsequent correspondence to complete the application must be completed by May 15. [GHSA Office]
3. Proposal to clarify equipment allowed in summer (contact) camps as follows:
Equipment is limited to helmets, shoulder pads and mouthpieces. Compression-style shorts, or any other shorts that have thigh pads and/or girdle pads are NOT allowed. [GHSA Office]

Lacrosse Committee

1. Proposal to Edit item "D" under General Information (page 77) to read: The number of Lacrosse matches allowed (not including state tournaments) shall be eighteen (18). If a region/area chooses to hold a region/area tournament, those matches must be included as part of the 18-game total allowed. [State Coordinator] Note: **Effective Immediately**

Literary Committee

1. Section L1 - Dramatic Interpretation. Proposal to change as follows (A & B together below):
 - A. Change name of event to Oral Interpretation.
 - B. Separate contests will be held in Humorous, Dramatic, and Duo Oral Interpretations in all classifications.
 - B.1 The selection should be of good literary value and appropriate to the contest.
 - B.3 A student may participate in only one individual contest in Oral Interpretation, but may also enter in the group event of Duo as per GHSA Rules.

2. Section L2 - Essay. Proposal to change as follows:
 - A. Separate contests will be held in Argumentative, Personal, and Rhetorical Essay in all classifications.
 - B.1c Three topics will be selected as appropriate for each essay discipline, or type of essay.
 - B.1d A student may participate in only one contest in Essay.
3. Section L3 - Extemporaneous Speaking. Proposal to change as follows:
 - A. Separate contests will be held in Domestic and International Extemporaneous Speaking in all classifications.
 - B.5 A student may participate in only one contest in Extemporaneous Speaking. [GHSA Office]

Swimming Committee

1. Proposal to implement a "Roster of Admissions" form for all coaches and participants in the State Swim Meet. The roster would be due 72 hours prior to the competition. [State Coordinator]
2. Proposal to increase the number of entries in the consolation finals at the State Swim Meet from 8 to 10 swimmers. The championship finals would thus be increased from 8 to 10 also, and 20 places would be scored rather than 16. [State Coordinator]

Track & Field Committee

1. Proposal to add the 4 x 800 meter relay to the "Schedule of Events" at the State Track Meets. This would increase the event total from 16 to 17. [Region 5-AAAAAA]
2. Proposal to alter the format of the boys and girls State Track Meets. The proposal is to combine genders at the two current sites (Jefferson and Albany) and split the two meets by classification with half competing at Jefferson and half at Albany [Region 5-AAAAAA]

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Executive Director Gary Phillips will address the committee on several issues and introduce some guest speakers.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT: ARTICLE III - SECTION 2 - Subsection D, (page 7) (Second vote):

Proposal to delete current "d" and add: The number of classifications and regions together with the assignment of schools therein shall be submitted to the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee, by majority vote, may approve, reject, or modify in any way the proposals submitted by the Reclassification Committee.

2. CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT: ARTICLE IV - SECTION 2 - Subsection D [new] (page 8) (Second vote)

Proposal to add: The Executive Committee shall have the authority to appoint smaller committees to address issues related to the operation of the Association and its regulated activities, and to consider proposals made by such committees. The authority of the Executive Committee shall be plenary in all matters pertaining to the Association and it may accept, reject, or modify any proposals made or action taken by any committee, the Board of Trustees, the Appeal Board, the Hardship Committee, or the Executive Director.

3. CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT: ARTICLE IV - SECTION 2 - Subsection E [new] (page 8) (Second vote)

Proposal to add: Each member of the Executive Committee shall have the right to vote on all matters coming before the full Executive Committee.

4. CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT: ARTICLE IV - SECTION 9 - Subsection H (page 12) (Second vote)

Proposal to delete sentence: Members of the Hardship Committee and the Appeal Board will not be eligible to vote (those members who heard a specific case) as a member of the Executive Committee when an appeal goes before the full Executive Committee.

5. Proposal to reconsider the addition of By-Law 1.62 (h), which was tabled at the September, 2013 meeting:

Students who are U.S. Citizens who have been enrolled in a high school in a foreign country for the equivalent of at least one full semester shall, upon return to the U.S., be eligible to participate at a GHSA member school provided that the student lives in the new school's service area and is otherwise eligible under GHSA age, eight-semester, academic and other eligibility rules. [GHSA office]
