## HSTHMUHONAL HIEAT POLICX

- Applies to practices and voluntary workouts in all sports
- ratio of work to rest and hydration
- length of workout session
- cancellation of outdoor workouts
- Policy must be signed by coach \& distributed to parents each season.
- All heat/humidity readings must be taken with a Wet Bulb Globe Temperature instrument.
- NOTE: WBGT "degrees" not same as thermometer

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## COACHING ISSUESS

- Community Coach may not coach same sport at two schools - even in same system
- Retired coaches (49\%) do not have to do more than just coach to be head coach
- GHSA official and/or officiating assignor may not coach at GHSA school in same sport


## MASCBhmansous

- No student may practice during the school day.
- School sets beginning/ending time
- Early release students may not practice during this time in the GHSA season for that sport
- Undue influence rule applies to student transferring to school whose coach coached player in an all-star game.

## SPORTSMANSHIP

- EJECTIONS - GHSA By-Law 2.72 (a) - Ejections are based on judgment calls by an official and are NOT reviewable or reversible. As such, once a player or coach has been ejected from a contest the ejection CANNOT be rescinded after the fact.
-COACHING - An individual who is an active official, or officials' assignor at the high school level, may not be a coach in the same sport.
-BY-LAWS - Each sanctioned GHSA Officiating Association must submit a current year association Constitution/ByLaws to be kept on file at the GHSA Office.


## STATE TOURNAMENT DOUBLE HEADERS

-When a school is hosting both boys' and girls' games. . .
-The host school must clear the double-header through the tournament director and officials' scheduling coordinator.
-A revised financial agreement is in effect for a double header, and the form is available is the "Forms Book" or GHSA web site

## NFHS Soccer Rules Changes

Misconduct Rule 12-8-1f(13), 12-8-2d(1)


Penalty for an intentional hand ball by a player - other than the goalkeeper - in the penalty box to prevent a goal from being scored. If the goal is prevented, the penalty remains a disqualification of the player; however, if the goal is scored, the penalty will now be a caution to the player who deliberately handled the ball.

Misconduct
Rule 12-8-2c


When a player receives a second caution in the same game, he/she will be disqualified with a red card and the team will play the remainder of the game without replacing the disqualified player (play shorthanded).

Misconduct Rule 12-8-2c, 5-3-1g


For a subsequent yellow card to the same player in the same game, first show the yellow card and then show the red card.


## Penalty Kick Rule 14-1-7 (new)



When, in the taking of a penalty kick, there is an unusual situation that causes a temporary suspension of play before the ball is played or touched by another player, or before the ball hits the goalpost or crossbar, the kick is retaken

Player Equipment Rule 4-1, 4-2


Player equipment rule begins with the players wearing only legal equipment. Coaches, as the adults of their teams, must work with their players and officials to ensure that player equipment is safe and legal. Officials must also emphasize player safety and legal equipment throughout the match.

## Coaching During an Injury

 Rule 3-3-1c1

When a coach or appropriate health-care professional is called onto the field to attend to an injured player, neither coach shall give instruction to their players.


Concussion Management Rule 3-3-1c3


The NFHS Sports Medicine Advisory Committee has noted an increase in reported and diagnosed concussions in the 2010-2011 National High School Sports Related Injury Surveillance Study. The position of the NFHS Sports Medicine Committee is that no athlete should return to play or practice on that same day after suffering a concussion.


Substitutions
Rule 3-3-1c1, 4-2-8


Wording of "athletic trainer" and "MD/DO" are changed to "appropriate health-care professional" to allow each association to follow state law.

Number of Players Rule 3-1-3

## Substitutions Rule 3-4-1b



After a goal is scored by either team, team A's coach may legally send substitute A13 directly into the game from the bench, without reporting to the scorer, for player A7.

## The Officials Rule 5-1-2

The officials retain clerical authority over the contest through the completion of any reports, including those imposing disqualifications, that are responsive to actions occurring while the referees had jurisdiction. State associations may intercede in the event of unusual incidents that occur before, during or after the officials' jurisdiction has ended or in the event that a contest is terminated prior to the conclusion of regulation play.

## Corner Kick Rule 17-1-1



A corner kick shall be awarded to the opposing team when a free kick taken from outside the penalty area goes untouched into a team's own goal.

## Major Editorial Changes

| $5-1-2$ | The jurisdiction of the officials shall begin 15 minutes prior to the start of the game and end with their leaving the field of play and its immediate surroundings. They shall enforce the rules, and their decisions on points of fact are final. The officials can only correct a decision so long as the game has not been restarted. The officials retain clerical authority over the contest through the completion of any reports, including those imposing disqualifications, that are responsive to actions occurring while the referees had jurisdiction. State associations may intercede in the event of unusual incidents that occur before, during or after the officials' jurisdiction has ended or in the event that a contest is terminated prior to the conclusion of regulation play. Protests of NFHS rules are not recognized. The officials shall not use video replays to assist in any decision. The officials shall not use any tobacco products during this period. |

| 9-1-3 | The referee shall sound the whistle when needed to indicate <br> that the ball is out of play or for a foul. A second whistle is required to restart play for the <br> taking of a penalty kick, after a substitution is made, after a <br> caution, disqualification, injury and after setting a wall prior to <br> a free kick. |

| 14-1-3 | The opposing goalkeeper shall stand on the goal line, between the goal posts, until the ball is kicked. Lateral movement is allowed, but the goalkeeper is not permitted to come off the line by stepping or lunging forward until the ball is in play. <br> PENALTY (ARTICLES 2 AND 3): Infringement by the defending team is not penalized if the goal is scored. If a goal is not scored on the penalty kick, it is retaken. If there is an infringement by the attacking team and the ball enters the goal, the goal does not count and the kick shall be retaken. If there is encroachment by the attacking team and the ball does not go into the goal, there is no rekick. If the ball rebounds into play or is deflected out of bounds by the goalkeeper, the game shall be stopped and restarted with an indirect free kick for the defending team at the location of the encroachment. If the ball is saved and held by the goalkeeper, play shall continue. In cases where players from both teams are guilty of infringements, the kick shall be retaken regardless of the outcome of the kick. |
