COMMITTEE REPORTS

(Committee reports constitute motions by the Chairman of the Committee, no seconds are required.)

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Report presented by Nathan Turner

The committee **RECOMMENDED**:

Proposal to modify By-Law 1.62 on page 19 of the GHSA Constitution as follows (new text in italic, old text struck out):

 (a) The student moved simultaneously with the entire parental unit or and all other persons he/she resided lived with at the former school residence, and the student and parent(s) or persons residing with the student live in the service area of the new school that residential unit moved into the service area of the new school with simultaneous enrollment of the student in the new school. This is known as a "bona fide move." (NOTE: A move within the same service area does not constitute a bona fide move.)

- (1) The student may choose the public or private school serving that area.
- (2) It must be apparent that the parent(s) or and all the persons residing with the student and the student have relinquished the residence in the former service area and have occupied a residence in the new service area. Effective Immediately (Vote: 13-0)

Motion Passed (Unanimously)

- Proposal to modify By-Law 1.72 on page 22 of the GHSA Constitution by adding the following (new text in italic): "A student athlete transferring from one school to another, or entering the ninth grade for the first time, shall be ruled ineligible for one year if it is proven that: ... (items a. through e. remain the same)." Effective Immediately (Vote: 11-0-2) Motion Passed (Unanimously)
- Proposal to add new "f" under By-Law 4.42 (Lifetime Passes) on page 44 of the GHSA Constitution as follows: (f) Retired Contest Officials with 30 years of active service in the GHSA. (Vote: 13-0) Motion Passed (Unanimously)
- Proposal to modify By-Law 4.57 on page 45 of the GHSA Constitution as follows (new text in italic, old text struck out):

 The "GHSA Officials Card Pass" will allow the legal bearer of the card Pass his/her admission (only) plus one (1) to all GHSA sanctioned events/activities. (Vote: 13-0)
 Motion Passed (Unanimously)

The committee **DENIED**:

Proposal to modify By-Law 2.69 (c) on page 33 of the GHSA Constitution as follows (new text in italic, old text struck out): "A GHSA coach (certified teacher or community coach) may not coach a *competitive* non-GHSA team in a competitive setting of the same gender he/she coaches in the GHSA during the same school year that includes any player(s) who participate in the sport he/she coaches at the member school. Exception stays same. (**Vote: 13-0**)

TENNIS COMMITTEE

Report Presented by Scarlett Grantham

The committee **RECOMMENDED**:

Proposal to change the restriction on Tennis competition from the current limit of 18 **matches** to 18 **playing dates**, with multiple matches allowed on any of those 18 dates. (Vote: 6-0) NOTE: The Tennis Committee voted 6-0 to modify the proposal to make it Effective Immediately. Motion Passed (Unanimously)

VOLLEYBALL COMMITTEE

Report Presented by Don Baker

The committee **RECOMMENDED**:

Proposal to modify item "4." under Miscellaneous Information on page 89 of the GHSA Constitution as follows (new text in italic, old text struck out): All varsity Region/Area Volleyball matches shall be officiated by at least one two († 2) officially dressed volleyball officials who is are registered under the GHSA plan for the registration of officials.

a) The host school must provide registered Line Judges or adults (21 years old or older) who have completed the Line Judge Course at learn.ghsa.net at all varsity matches.

b) The host school must provide an adult (21 years old or older) to maintain the official scorebook and libero tracker sheet at all varsity matches. (Vote: 8-0)

Motion Passed 70-4 (Griffis, Ricketts, Connell and Tison voted No)

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Executive Director Robin Hines call on Assistant Executive Director Ernie Yarbrough, who presented awards from the NFHS for Georgia's Contest Officials of the Year.

Hines then spoke to the committee about a GHSA survey regarding the possibility of moving the sport of Golf from the Spring to the Fall. Hines reminded the committee that the Constitution gives the authority of setting season beginning and ending dates for all sports to the GHSA office, but said he wanted to gather as much information as possible in order to make an informed decision. He told the committee the survey was 52 percent in favor of leaving Golf in the Spring and asked for a show of hands from the committee that showed about the same percentages.

Hines then informed the committee that the Atlanta Falcons had offered their indoor practice facility for the state semifinal Flag Football games this year.

He then went on to say that discussions were still taking place about the possibility of moving the state football championship games back to the Mercedes-Benz Stadium at some point in the future, possibly as early as 2023.

Hines then called upon GHSA council Alan Connell, who gave a brief update of legal issues facing the GHSA. Connell spoke of two issues involving the sport of wrestling that have been ongoing for years. He said one might be coming to an end soon, but the other was recently extended by a judge's ruling.

Hines gave a brief update of two legislative issues involving the GHSA, and then gave the annual financial report. He told the committee that, with the current situation on Wall Street, the long-term investments were down. But he said all other financial issues were in excellent shape, so much so that membership dues have been waived for a third straight year and the GHSA office will be issuing checks very soon to all member schools in the amount of their dues and catastrophic insurance premiums.

Hines thanked the committee for all their hard work and dedication to the association and then turned the meeting back over to President Finch, who called for a motion to adjourn.

Motion by Simpson, second by Crews, to adjourn the meeting. MOTION PASSED (unanimously)
