

GHSA Votes to Give Member Schools Financial Help

At the spring meeting of the GHSA Executive Committee, several very important decisions were made to ease a little of the financial burden being experienced by member schools.

FOR THE 2010-2011 SCHOOL YEAR ONLY, the GHSA will not collect dues from member schools, and will pay 100% of the premium for the catastrophic insurance policy on students participating in GHSA activities.

This amounts to about a \$245,000 decrease in revenue for the GHSA in the next fiscal year. If gate receipts at playoff contests and/or revenue from corporate partners and licensees cannot make up that difference, then the association will need to draw out of its reserve fund for the first time ever.



For the most part, the 2009-2010 school year has been a good year for the GHSA. The quality of the competitions keeps getting better in all sports, and the revenue from fall sports was quite good considering the state of the economy. Money was returned to schools for early playoff rounds in Softball and Volleyball for the first time ever. The GHSA venture into on-line rules clinics was largely successful, although there is always a "learning curve" when new procedures are introduced. This format will continue in 2010-2011.

There are some areas in which the GHSA has encountered challenges this year. For the most part, we are working through those issues, but the general tone of financial cuts to education will be a challenge for all of us for a while.

At several conferences for educators recently, I have heard that we are experiencing the "**NEW NORMAL**." All of us have to realize that we are operating in a different world of education. We may not be able to rely on "tried and true" policies and procedures in this rapidly changing world.

OUR MAJOR TASK IS TO DETERMINE WHAT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES JUST CANNOT BE DISCARDED, AND WHICH ONES NEED TO BE ADJUSTED TO MEET NEW SITUATIONS. And we have to do that with less money.

ATTENTION: 2010 Online Rules Clinics!

MINUTES

The semiannual meeting of the Executive Committee of the Georgia High School Association was called to order at 9:00 a.m. on March 22, 2010, at the Ramada Inn Convention Complex, Forsyth, Georgia, by Dr. Gary Holmes, President. COMMITTEE REPORTS

BOARD OF TRUSTEES:

Report presented by Wayne Tootle

The Committee recommended:

Change By-Law 2.63 (c2) to read: "Schools that fail to fulfill the requirements of a scheduled event may be required to make restitution to the competing school is unable to secure an opponent. The offended school shall petition the Executive Director for the desired restitution."

Motion Passed (voice vote)

Add new By-Law 4.26 (i): "Charter schools that apply for membership after the reclassification process has been completed will be accepted as schools playing sub-varsity schedules and/or non-region varsity schedules for the next reclassification cycle." <u>Motion Passed</u> (voice vote)

Adopting the 2010-11 budget with amendment.

Note: For 2010-2011 only, schools will pay no dues and the GHSA will pay 100% of the catastrophic insurance premium. <u>Motion Passed</u> (voice vote)

BASKETBALL COMMITTEE:

The Committee recommended:

Prohibiting teams from warming up at the halftime intermission of the preceding game. <u>Motion Passed</u> (voice vote)

To permanently set the schedule for first and second round playoff games with first round girls' games played on Friday and boys' games on Saturday, and second round girls' games on Tuesday and boys' games on Wednesday. Motion Passed (voice vote)

CALENDAR COMMITTEE:

Report presented by Donnie Griggers

The Committee recommended:

Approving the decisions made by Soccer, Softball, and Tennis committees in regard to calendar changes for those sports. Approving the revised 2010-11 calendar and also the newly formulated 2011-12 calendars.
