

We Must Value and Protect School-Based Athletics

The months of February and March are packed with the final stages of the Winter Championships. We have already completed the Team Dual Wrestling Championships, and there were great performances by outstanding athletes and coaches at those events.

In the next few weeks, there will be championships in Swimming and Diving, Traditional Wrestling, and boys and girls Basketball. Literally thousands of student athletes will compete at these three events. Thousands of spectators will pack venues around the state to watch these great events. Even more will observe the action via radio, television, and streaming outlets. Be sure to check this newsletter and the GHSA web site for important information about these events. It is truly a time to celebrate high school athletics and their role in the educational process.

At recent meetings involving administrators from state high school associations across the country, there have been discussions that made many of us uneasy. We



can no longer assume that high school athletics are going to continue just as they have been in the past. Important issues must be addressed to insure that high school athletics will be a stable force in the lives of the young people of America.

Economic pressures impact every aspect of school life – including sports and competitive activities. Concerns about the health and safety of students are getting national attention. There are Congressional hearings going on currently that are investigating concussions and other brain injures sustained in athletics – from high school to the professional ranks. There are ongoing concerns about student-athletes using performance enhancing drugs and supplements – substances that have severe health risks involved with their usage.

I went on a rapid journey from the "celebration of high school athletics" to "threats of the future of high school athletics" for a particular purpose. We will be more likely to work through the threats if we are convinced of the value of high school athletics as a part of the total educational framework. Since many of the problems are new to us, then new strategies must be developed to keep high school sports headed in the right direction.

Let's rededicate ourselves to the traditional purposes of school-based athletics while looking for new ways to implement those programs. And let's enjoy the products of our programs as our students grow and develop in so many ways.

Please insure that the following statement is read as a public address announcement prior to the start of **every GHSA sanctioned contest**:

"The GHSA and its member schools have made a commitment to promote good sportsmanship by student/athletes, coaches, and spectators at all GHSA sanctioned events. Profanity, degrading remarks, and intimidating actions directed at officials or competitors will not be tolerated, and are grounds for removal from the event site. Spectators are not allowed to enter the competition area during warm-ups or while the contest is being conducted. Thank you for your cooperation in the promotion of good sportsmanship at today's event."

GHSA Reminders:

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE ITEMS: Anyone wishing to have an item included on the agenda for the March State Executive Committee meeting must submit the item to the GHSA office by February 19, 2010. The State Executive Committee meeting will be held March 22, 2010 at the Ramada Inn (former Holiday Inn) in Forsyth.

FOOTBALL SCHEDULES: Coaches and/or Athletic Directors are reminded that 2010 varsity Football Schedules are due in the GHSA office no later than March 1, 2010. If your school has hired a new coach for the 2010 season, please make sure he is made aware of this deadline.

OPEN MEET DEADLINE: Member schools are reminded that April 1, 2010 is the deadline to notify the GHSA of entry in Open Meet State Events such as Volleyball, Lacrosse, AA/A Soccer, Wrestling, Riflery and Gymnastics for the school year 2010-2011. The form for notification can be found on the GHSA web site.

SPRING CHEERLEADING TRYOUTS: Cheerleading practice/tryouts are limited to a maximum of 10 consecutive days per school between February 1 and the last day students are in school. Once tryouts are complete, no further practices may be held until school is out.

State Football TV Ratings Soar!

Georgia Public Broadcasting was the most-watched public station in the country in prime time and full day on Friday and Saturday (December 11-12, 2009) of the GHSA Football State Championships, according to TRAC Media Services.

GPB had a 42 percent increase in ratings from its coverage a year ago, with an estimated 428,600 Georgia households watching the live games.

Supporting the broadcasts were Georgia Electric Membership Corporation, Georgia Student Finance Commission, State Farm and Regions Bank.

State Swimming and Diving Meets

The 2010 **State Diving Championship** will be held Wednesday and Thursday, February 10-11, at The **Marist** School.

The 2010 State Swimming Championships for Class AAAAA will be at the The Westminster School in Atlanta on February 11 & 13. Teams in the other classifications will swim at Westminster on February 12-13.

Admission is \$7 per day at any site.

Free admission will be allowed for the following: 1. Swimmers and divers qualified and entered in the State Meet; 2. Coaches that are listed on the Swimming and Diving Coaches list; 3. Four girls and four boys designated as substitutes by the coach on the team list; 4. Two team attendants or trainers as listed on the team roster; 5. Qualifying Standards - Diving

A diver may become eligible for the State Meet using a 6dive sheet or an 11-dive sheet.

1) 6-DIVE: The degree of difficulty of dives 2-6 when totaled shall be equal to or more than 10.4 for both boys and girls. The score to be achieved must be 200 points or more.

2) 11-DIVE: The minimum degree of difficulty for optional dives shall be 11.5 for girls and 12.0 for boys. The score to be achieved for both boys and girls is 270 points or more.
