
Legislative Update for Items Affecting the GHSA


As of this writing, it is Crossover Day in the General Assembly. Dr. Jimmy Stokes of GAEL wrote a great article on the significance of Crossover Day in the "GAEL Flyer" this week and I encourage you to read it as Dr. Stokes provides a good explanation of the General Assembly's process of how a bill becomes law.

In short, bills that don't cross over from one chamber to the other are considered dead and must be brought up in another session. There are ways that bills or parts of bills can be added to other bills late in the process, so anything can happen up to the last day of the session. We have experienced this in the past, but this has been a very good session up to this point and we have enjoyed great communication and collaboration with our legislators.

There were two bills dropped with significance to the Georgia High School Association. House Bill 1104, sponsored by Omari Crawford, addresses mental health risks for student athletes.

The bill involves mental health screening and the preparticipation physical





The second bill is house bill 1276 which is the Georgia High School NIL Protection Act sponsored by Representative Brent Cox. I have been speaking to Representative Cox regarding Name, Image and Likeness for over a year and his passion for this is genuine and is designed to educate families and provide structure to the NIL process in the high school space. He has taken our policy/guidance and followed it within the bill. There are operational issues regarding agents/ representatives, trust funds and enforcement included that need more work.

He has decided to "slow walk" this legislation to give us time to study the issue this summer to ensure we are taking correct steps. Representative Cox has been great to work with and is a former coach in our state. While NIL won't be addressed in legislation this year, I look forward to working with Representative Cox this summer and fall to make sure future legislation around NIL in the high school space is appropriate for our student athletes, their families and the GHSA.

I'll be sure to keep you updated on any legislative issue that requires action from the GHSA and its member schools.

The third of four qualifying tournaments in Bass Fishing will take place on March 16 at West Point Lake in LaGrange. Below is more information on the event:

Practice:

- Competition waters open for practice until 5 p.m. on March 15.
- The purchasing of, or bartering for, information or the hiring of fishing guide services will not be permitted after March 5.

Boat Operation:

 Contestants are not permitted to drive the boat when the combustion engine is in operation. Each boat will be driven by a coach or volunteer driver. Contestants may operate the trolling motor. Coaches and volunteers may provide assistance, including information about locating and catching fish, but are not permitted to fish.

Catch & Size Limit:

• Five bass per team; minimum 14 inches on largemouth and 12 inches on spotted bass.

License Requirement:

• A Valid GA fishing license is required for students 16 and older.

Format:

• Each GHSA approved school may enter up to six boats in each regional competition. The top 15 boats from each regional advance to the state Championship. One additional boat will advance from each regional for every 10 boats that compete over a minimum of 100 boats in the regional. Boats advance from the first event in which they qualified. If a boat has already qualified for the state championship, the next eligible boat will advance.

Basketball State Finals March 6-9 at the Macon Centreplex

The 2024 GHSA / Dr. Ralph Swearngin State Basketball Tournament, presented by Breda Pest Management, will include 17 state championship games, along with a boys Slam Dunk contest and a girls Three-Point contest.

And for the third year in a row, the March 6-9 event will include a CoEd three-point contest featuring two-person teams of a boy and girl from the same high school.

The four-day championship round will tip off on Wednesday, March 6 with four finals. The Class A, Div. 2

girls will get things start-Dr. Ralph Swearngi ed at 1:00 p.m., followed the A, Div. 2 by bovs at 3:00 p.m. Class Then the 4A girls and boys play the last two games 5:00, and 7:00, respectively. games will be played the Macon Centreplex again this year.

Tickets each day are \$15 and are available ONLY via GoFan. No tickets will be sold at the site. Parking is again free of charge for this event.

Thursday's schedule also begins at 1:00 p.m., with the Class 2A and then 5A championships. The CoEd three-point contest will follow the 2A boys final.

Friday's action begins at 1:00 p.m., with the 3A and then the 6A title contests. The Girls 3-point shooting contest will follow the 3A boys championship game.

The action concludes Saturday beginning at 11:00 a.m., with first the A, Division 1 and then the 7A championships. In between, at 3:00 p.m., the 27th annual AAASP Wheelchair Championship will be held.

The fourth GHSA Slam Dunk Contest, will take place following the AAASP championship. Both the three-point shooting events and the slam dunk contest are presented by BSN Sports.

Then on March 23, the Class A, Division 2 and 2A finals will take place at Georgia Military College while Buford High School will host the 4A and 7A competition.




