# 'History of GHSA' Contains Some Surprising Facts

As part of an Employee Handbook we are working on in the GHSA office, I recently gave Media Director Steve Figueroa the task of compiling a brief history of the GHSA. Using numerous published resources, he came up with some interesting facts about our organization.

For example, did you know that the GHSA was headquarted in Athens for the first few years. Only after Sam Burke was hired did the office move to its present location of Thomaston.

And, can you guess how many member schools there were in 1936? Would you believe 419? Most people believe a membership of 400+ is a fairly recent revelation, but the GHSA first went over that number almost 80 years ago! So, here is more of the History of the GHSA:

The present-day Georgia High School Association was organized in 1908 under the direction of its first president, Dr. Joseph S. Stewart, who had come to the University of Georgia in 1903 primarily to work with the high schools in the state.

The GHSA is a voluntary organization composed of over 450 public, charter and private high schools with more than 150,000 students participating in GHSA programs. Member schools are divided according to size so that each will have an opportunity to compete for honors among schools near their own size. The state is divided into regions in each classification. Each region is operated by the schools within that region.



The GHSA operates under a Constitution and By-Laws which contains the standards of eligibility to be met by high school pupils for attaining the privilege of participation in interschool contests, and rules controlling the participation among schools. By adoption of the Constitution and By-Laws through its membership, member schools have by their initiative acted to operate and discipline their interscholastic activities and contests.

The rules-making body of the GHSA is the State Executive Committee, composed of members elected from every region within the GHSA classification structure as well as several at-large members representing other important educational and athletic organizations.

The operation of the GHSA is the responsibility of the Executive Director and his staff. Although the position was called Executive Secretary-Treasurer at the time, Sam F. Burke became the first full-time director of the GHSA in 1946. Previously, Mr. Sam, as he was known, filled the same role on a part-time basis beginning in 1939 while also serving as Superintendent of Schools in Thomaston, where the GHSA is headquartered.

Burke retired in 1976 and was followed as Executive Director by Bill Fordham (1976-1991), Tommy Guillebeau (1991-2001), Ralph Swearngin (2001-2014) and Gary Phillips (2014 - ).

The GHSA joined the National Federation of State High School Associations in 1928, becoming the 28th member at the time. The GHSA currently sponsors state championship programs in 15 boys and 15 girls sports and activities.

1946 - Burke becomes first full-time director of GHSA on October 1

1946 – Sportsmanship Committee was formed to deal with acts of poor sportsmanship

1948 – First official state-wide football playoff system adopted

1950 - Thomaston launderette becomes first independent GHSA office facility

1956 - Added a fifth classification, AAA, for state's largest schools

1972 - GHSA office expanded on same site as original launderette

1972 – Went back to only four (4) classifications, eliminating Class "C"

1976 - Bill Fordham becomes second full-time Executive Director

1978 – Renamed the four classifications, eliminating the Class "B" designation

1991 - Tommy Guillebeau becomes third full-time Executive Director

2000 – Added a fifth classification, AAAAAA, for the state's largest schools

2001 - Ralph Swearngin becomes fourth full-time Executive Director

2003 – GHSA office more than doubles in size with addition to original building

2012 - Split Class "A" playoff competition into Public and Private championships

2014 - Gary Phillips becomes fifth full-time Executive Director.

# **Class A Football Procedures!**

Nov. 7 - Region winners in all classifications must be determined and results entered into MaxPreps web site.

Nov. 9 - Region playoff qualifiers in all classifications must be submitted to GHSA office by 9:00 a.m.

Nov. 10 - MaxPreps' final Class A power ratings will be posted on the GHSA web site.

### Nov. 11 -

- (1) Any Class A school that believes its power rating points are incorrect may file an appeal in writing to the GHSA between 8:00 a.m. - 12 noon. The appeal letter must be accompanied by a complete list of results and points earned for each game.
- (2) The GHSA Appeals Committee will meet at 1:00 p.m., to verify the results (including the appeals), and break any ties.
- (3) The results of the appeals and the resulting playoff brackets will be posted later that day on the GHSA web site (once posted, the results are final).

NOTE: Teams winning a Region Championship will be placed in the brackets first based on their respective power rating numbers. Then the rest of the brackets will be completed based on the power rating numbers.

Nov. 20 - First round games of Class A Football playoffs will begin. There will be four (4) rounds of playoffs in Class A, five (5) rounds in the other classifications, all leading up to the Championship games on Dec. 11-12 in the Georgia Dome.

The 2015 GHSA State Cross Country Championships for all classifications will be held at the Carrollton High School course on Saturday, November 7 (see course map to the right of this text).


The finish line will be video streamed LIVE on the NFHSNetwork.com/GHSA. (Subscription rates will apply.)

Four teams in each region (classes 2A through 6A) and four teams from each Area in Class A (public and private) will qualify for the State Meet and must be determined by Saturday, October 31, 2015.

In addition, the first six individual finishers from each region or area will qualify for the state meet even if their teams do not.

# **Nominations for Positive Athlete**

The nominations window for the 2015-16 Positive Athlete Georgia program is now officially open. From now until March 15th, 2016, Positive Athlete will be accepting nominations for positive high school athletes in any grade, in any sport, from any public or private school in the state of Georgia.

This is the third year of a program developed with the help of former Forest Park High School, University of Georgia, and Super Bowl XL MVP Hines Ward.

"We're not putting out a search for the best athletes in Georgia," said Hines Ward, "We're searching for kids with positive attitudes whose efforts don't necessarily show up on the stat sheets. These kids are also positive role models in their schools who get involved in charitable causes, have already learned the meaning of giving back at an early age, and many have overcome difficult circumstances and remained positive."

Nominating a student athlete takes less than 10 minutes to do, and creates an opportunity for a student-athlete to have something on his/her resume or job application even if they do not win an award. Nominations can only be submitted through the Positive Athlete GA Website via the online nominations form. **Website:** http://georgia.positiveathlete.org

There is no cost to nominate a Positive Athlete in Georgia. Last year over 2,000 student-athletes and coaches were nominated from over 150 high schools in 35 counties. Over \$10,000 in college scholarship money and additional opportunities for the nominees will be available for the most qualified nominees, especially those nominated early. There will be regional awards programs in the Spring to honor student-athletes throughout the state, and the state-wide award winners are honored at the College Football Hall of Fame in downtown Atlanta in June.

### **Guidelines for PA Announcers**

The following are guidelines, responsibilities and restrictions for PA announcers at GHSA basketball games:

The announcer shall be prohibited from making an announcement while the clock is running and while the clock is stopped and the ball is alive, such as during a free throw, a throw in, etc. Doing so could potentially affect communication of coaches, players or be disconcerting. The announcer shall be prohibited from interrupting the game through the use of the microphone unless there is an emergency.

Announcements or comments shall be made during those times when there is a stoppage of the clock and the ball is not live, such as time outs, between quarters, pre-game, half time and post-game. The announcer is allowed to announce basic information that does not potentially affect the play in general, the players, the coaches, or the officials. The announcer's information is not official information and could be misinformation shared with all. Appropriate training of announcers by school personnel and proper pre-game instruction by the Referee are both necessary.

### **Announcer's Responsibilities:**

The announcer's role does not include "cheering the home team on" or otherwise inciting the crowd. Doing so is common at other levels of athletic events. But high school athletics is different because sports are educationally based.

In a very real sense, the public address announcer at a high school event is a "Champion of Character." He/she can influence the atmosphere of the contest by what is said and how it is said.

The announcer who performs professionally promotes good sportsmanship by what he/she says and how he/she acts upon saying it.

MaxPreps is the "Official Statistician and Media Partner" for the GHSA. MaxPreps offers coaches a free stat management and communication platform that enables you to efficiently submit your schedule, scores, roster and statistics. MaxPreps is a 100% free service and the official source of scores and stats for the GHSA.

All GHSA basketball teams statewide must submit game results to MaxPreps, regardless of classification. This information will be used to verify GHSA Region Standings and manage Class A Power Ratings. In addition, all information submitted will be used to power the statewide statistical leader boards.

# NFHS' Heart of the Arts and Spirit of Sports Awards Nominations

The National Federation of State High School Associations has developed programs to recognize worthy students in the Arts (Heart of the Arts) and in Sports (Spirit of Sports). These awards are not primarily to reward winners of games and or championships, but to recognize those students that make or have made an extraordinary effort to succeed, sometimes against a great deal of adversity.

Forms may be found on the GHSA web site to nominate a student that your school would like to submit in either or both disciplines (only one per school in each).

The GHSA must receive your school's nominations by January 22, 2016 and must submit the winning nominations by February 1, to the National Federation of High Schools (NFHS).

Each of the eight sections (Georgia is in Section 3) must choose a winner from their section, and those nominees will be sent on to determine the NFHS recipient, that will be honored at the NFHS 2016 Summer Meeting.

The Spirit of Sports Award is in its 11th year and this is the third year for the Heart of the Arts Award. Georgia had 10 nominations last year for the Heart of the Arts Award and submitted a nomination to the NFHS. We at GHSA would like to ask each of you that has a student or students that meets the criteria listed, to nominate someone from your school. GHSA will send out reminders as we approach the deadline for nominations, but please start the process at your school in the near future, before everything gets so hectic in December and January.


# **ACT and SAT Assessment Dates**
