

Congratulations to AAASP's Bev Vaughn on her Retirement

This year is the 25th year of the American Association of Adapted Sports Programs which is 25 years of transforming lives and athletics. The American Association of Adapted Sports Programs (AAASP) exists to provide disabled students the opportunity to experience the benefits of school sports competition just as their non-disabled peers.

As you are aware, GHSA sports and activities provide an extension of the educational process for students as well as providing a fertile landscape for teaching life skills such as leadership, being a good follower, goal setting, work ethics and being a good citizen. I'm sure you agree that these characteristics should be provided for disabled students as well and those who are not. These opportunities are provided with the GHSA's partnership with AAASP. They provide published competition rules, standardized seasons, safety guidelines, coaches and officials training as well as compliance guidelines and inclusive policies.

Bev Vaughn has served as the Executive Director for AAASP since its inception and done a great job championing this special group of athletes for the past 25 years and is retiring from this position although she will continue to serve in an advisory role. It has been a joy working with her in providing sports for this

group of athletes. She has had such a positive impact on countless students and their families. Many students have earned college scholarships through her efforts and the experiences enjoyed by their families are immeasurable. Our congratulations and deep gratitude is due to AAASP and Bev Vaughn for her tireless efforts.

If your school and students are not currently involved in this program I encourage you to reach out to me or AAASP (adaptedsports.com) and we will show you how these opportunities may be provided for your athletes. Congratulations to Bev for a job well done!

We are in the process of reclassifying our schools to prepare for the next two years. The reclassification committee has worked very hard to set up the process moving forward. As I'm sure you are aware, there is a multiplier of 3.0 set for "out of district" students that will be applied to ALL schools. The FTE numbers for the October count by the GaDOE are projected to be released the first or second week of November. Out-of-district numbers were due October 15 and the GHSA office is prepared to calculate the numbers and place schools in classifications as soon as we receive them. Once published, schools have the opportunity to appeal their placement.

Once this list is finalized by the reclassification committee, the GHSA office will place schools in regions. Schools again will have the opportunity to appeal this placement. Once this is completed, the reclassification committee will approve and present the plan to the full State Executive Committee to be ratified. Once ratified, schools may schedule games for the following two-year cycle. The dates of appeals are TBA as all depends on the availability of the FTE count.

Thank you for all you do for the young people of the great state of Georgia and as always feel free to call me or any of the staff if we can do anything for you.

GHSA Policy for Live Streaming

Attention ADs: With the football playoffs rapidly approaching, this is a good time to remind member schools of the GHSA broadcast policies.

During the regular season, the HOST school owns the rights to its events and must give permission for the visiting school to produce a broadcast (audio or video). The host school can use any platform it chooses to broadcast its own regular season events.

But the GHSA owns the rights to all state playoff events and anyone wishing to produce an audio or video broadcast of an event MUST secure a contract from the GHSA prior to the event and pay a right's fee. This includes any streaming of the event, whether it be by the school, a parent or an outside media entity, and no matter the platform (even personal YouTube channels).

No streaming of a state playoff event in ANY sport is allowed without first securing a contract from the GHSA. Email Media Director Steve Figueroa (stevefig@ghsa.net) to request a broadcast contract.

The only exception to this rule is if the school is a member of the NFHS School Broadcast Program (SBP). All schools participating in the SBP may live-stream any contest their team is participating in during the state playoffs (without a contract or fee) with the following exceptions: Cheerleading Sectionals, Football Semifinals, Basketball Semifinals and all neutral-site state finals.

If a school is hosting a state playoff event and the visiting team is an SBP member, the host school must allow the visiting school to stream the event without a fee.


In addition, if the visiting school is uploading the stream to the NFHS Network, the host school is prohibited from originating a separate stream on another platform. The NFHS Network has exclusive rights to any state playoff events it wishes to put on its network. If the host school is also an SBP member, then it also may stream the event.

If a school is hosting a playoff event and an outside entity wishes to broadcast or stream the event, but does not have a contract from the GHSA, the host school should not allow the broadcast.




