GHSA Office Doing More Things Electronically

When I measure my age in calendar years, I feel old. When I consider the number and quality of the innovations that I have seen during those years, I feel really old. In small steps, the Georgia High School Association is trying to move into the world of communication that exists in the 21st century.

The GHSA web site (www.ghsa.net) has been greatly enhanced in the past few weeks. The addition of the Constitution and By-laws to the web site represents a major change in GHSA procedures. It was apparent that many coaches never saw one of the "White Books" that was sent out to each school. Now everyone on the staff can have access to that information. Please note that the format has changed a little bit. Information that does not fit into the Constitution, the By-laws, or a sport procedure has now been placed in a series of appendices. It is the responsibility of administrators and coaches of member schools to know the GHSA rules that affect their students and their competitive programs.



The web site format has been revamped in an attempt to make navigation easier. Much more attention has been given to calendar notations that can be accessed in several different ways. We encourage people to look at the web site first, and then call the office if questions persist. Please note the new "online store" and the links to our fine corporate partners.

There are other changes in the communication process between the GHSA office and member schools. Obviously the GHSA newsletter has been sent electronically rather than through the mail. The use of bulk emails has been used with some degree of success. There is a major area of attention needed here, however. Contact persons at each school and their email addresses change more rapidly than the physical address of the school. Please enable the GHSA to communicate with you more effectively by letting us know when you change the contact person, or when that person changes his/her email address. This needs to be an ongoing process throughout the school year. The GHSA is investigating some additional communication systems that will allow for quicker communication in times of emergency. Be watching for more information about this.

For the time being, the GHSA will not be handling eligibility filings electronically. This may happen in the future, but the privacy issues and the need for additional documentation have been a challenge. Other items will also be sent out on paper, but the number and the size of "all-school mailings" will be decreasing. If these technological changes create difficulties at your schools, please let us know.

Up to 40 awards will be presented each year, one for each of the eight regions within the GHSA's five classifications. The first Cooperative Spirit Sportsmanship Awards cover the 2005-06 school year and will be presented to the winning schools during halftime at fall football games.

Scholar/Athlete and Scholar/Manager Awards Programs

The Scholar/Athlete Awards Program and the Whitey Zimmerman Scholarships Program will be in place again this year, sponsored by Chevron/Texaco, the Atlanta Falcons Youth Foundation, Gallagher Electric & Engineering Company, Inc., and the National Football Foundation & College Football Hall of Fame, Inc.

The awards' presentation will be held in conjunction with the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl luncheon on December 29, 2006. Honorees must commit to being present at the awards luncheon in order to receive their awards.

Nomination forms are provided online for both scholarships. Go to www.ghsa.net to download the forms. They must be completed and submitted to your Region

Secretary no later than November 1, 2006.

There will be 40 scholarships for Scholar/Athletes (one winner from each region) of \$1,000.00 each and the overall winner will receive an additional \$1,000.00 scholarship.

The winners will be selected on the basis of 40 percent academic achievement, 40 percent football achievement and 20 percent community leadership.

Each school may submit two senior **Athlete** nominees to their Region Secretary. The region will select the top two nominees to be submitted to the State Selection Committee.

An additional scholarship program has been made available to recognize outstanding Scholar/Managers with the

Whitey Zimmerman Scholarships.

There will be 12 winners selected (two from each classification and two at-large) with a \$1,000.00 scholarship going to each. The honorees will be selected on the basis of 40 percent academic achievement, 40 percent football managing achievement and 20 percent community leadership.

Each school may submit one senior **Manager** nominee to their Region Secretary and the region will then select the top nominee to be submitted to the State Selection Committee.

Final honorees will be notified by November 30, 2006 and will be expected to attend the awards luncheon on December 29, 2006.

STATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE August 28, 2006

MINUTES

The semiannual meeting of the State Executive Committee of the Georgia High School Association was called to order at 9:00 a.m. on August 28, 2006, at the Crowne Plaza Hotel, Macon, Georgia, by Dr. Gary Holmes, President. Following is a condensed version of the minutes of that meeting. A complete version may be found on the GHSA web site.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

BOARD OF TRUSTEES: Report presented by Wayne Tootle.
The Committee recommended:

Establish a Policy on Practices in Hot Weather:

- (A) Beginning March 1, 2007, each member school shall have a written policy for conducting practices (all sports) during times of extremely high heat and/or humidity that will be distributed each year to players over the signature of the head coach. The policy shall include, but is not limited to:
 - (1) the time of day the practices are to be scheduled at various heat index levels
 - (2) the ratio of workout time to time allotted for rest and hydration at various heat index levels
- (3) the heat index level that will cause practice to be terminated outdoors
- (B) Additionally, a scientifically-approved instrument that measures the heat index must be utilized at each practice to insure the written policy is being followed properly.

The GHSA is to make the request that the State Board of Education consider adopting this proposal as a state rule.

MOTION PASSED (voice vote)

Delete the phrase "including summer activities" from By-Law 1.21.

MOTION PASSED (voice vote) EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

Establish a policy on "Open Events" (new By-Law 2.62 [d4]) to read:

In all GHSA sanctioned sports, there may not be any "open" competitions or exhibition performances that extend participation beyond the three levels of competition (i.e., varsity, JV, 9th grade) mandated in this By-Law. The only interscholastic contests in which results are disregarded are scrimmages or jamborees noted in the respective sport sections of the By-Laws.

MOTION PASSED (voice vote)

The Board of Trustees received as information:

- (1) A meeting will be held with organizations that work with literary competitions and a report will be given at the next Executive Committee meeting to look for better ways to administer those events.
- (2) The "dead week" will be interpreted as applying to school-organized activities only.

BASKETBALL COMMITTEE: Report presented by Charlie Henderson
The Committee recommended:

Amend the format for First Round of Playoffs to allow doubleheaders when the host school is #1 and/or #2 seed in both boys and girls even when non-common opponents are involved.

- A. Must be by unanimous vote by all three schools involved with written approval of the principals of each school.
- B. Must be played on Saturday

MOTION PASSED (voice vote) EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

Set the format for First Round that girls games be played on Friday and boys games be played on Saturday each year with no rotation.

MOTION FAILED Show of Hands: Yes - 22 No - 23

ELIGIBILITY COMMITTEE: Report presented by Glenn White
The Committee recommended:

Revise By-Law 1.45c to read:

An eighth grade student who has been retained for academic reasons is ineligible for participation on a sub-varsity high school team.

MOTION PASSED (voice vote)

STATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES, *Continued*

FOOTBALL COMMITTEE: Report presented by Earl Etheridge.
The Committee recommended:

Reword D-2, page 61, to read as follows:

At school workouts from the end of spring practice until the first day of practice in the fall, players may wear no other protective football equipment except helmets and mouthpieces for all voluntary workouts and passing league games. School teams may attend camps during the summer as long as they adhere to the above regulation.

MOTION PASSED (voice vote)

GYMNASTICS COMMITTEE: Report presented by Lucia Norwood
The Committee recommended:

Moving the season forward by one week to have the State Meet the first weekend in May, beginning 2007-08.

MOTION PASSED (voice vote)

OFFICIALS COMMITTEE: Report presented by Earl Etheridge
The Committee recommended:

Increase cheerleading officials pay as follows: \$7.00 per team up to 20 teams (minimum 12 teams), \$6.00 per team for each team above 20. (Note: With this increase, cheerleading judges have been removed from the emergency travel pay procedure.)

MOTION PASSED (voice vote) EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

Keep in place the emergency travel pay approved by the Executive Committee in June 2006, through the 2007-08 school year at which time it will be reevaluated.

MOTION PASSED (voice vote)

Point of Emphasis:

In all sports in which GHSA sanctioned development camps are conducted, officials will be required to attend such camps once within a two year period to be considered for post season assignment.

RECLASSIFICATION COMMITTEE: Report presented by Earl Etheridge
The Committee recommended:

Isolation Policy: The Executive Director shall have the authority to work with any school that is geographically isolated within its region in order to resolve travel and time out of class difficulties.

MOTION PASSED (voice vote)

Received as information:

A proposal by Brooks County High School to classify with four classifications in the regular season, and eight classes for playoffs.

SOCCER COMMITTEE: Report presented by Dave Hunter
The Committee recommended:

Mandating completed games in playoffs:

(A) By-Law 2.93d - Note 2 (page 39): Football games played between schools from the same classification, and all region **and playoff** soccer matches must be played to completion. Any interrupted game must be replayed from the point of interruption. The school that is behind in the score may choose not to continue the game.

(B) Page 73 - new "N": All region and playoff soccer matches must be played to completion unless the team that is behind chooses not to complete the match. Matches that are interrupted by weather or mechanical difficulties will be replayed from the point of interruption.

MOTION PASSED (voice vote) EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

Modify the seating requirements to host a playoff match (page 74 D-1) as follows:

A/AA - 750; AAA - 1,000; AAAA - 1,500; AAAAA - 2,000

MOTION PASSED (voice vote) EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

Add new D-4, page 74, (playoffs) to read: The playing area must be configured in such a way that spectators must enter through an admission gate.

MOTION PASSED (voice vote) EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

STATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES, *Continued*

Add new D-5, page 74, (playoffs) to read: The field must be sufficiently lighted to allow for night play for all semifinal and championship matches.

MOTION PASSED (voice vote) EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

SPORTSMANSHIP COMMITTEE: Report presented by Lucia Norwood

The Committee recommended the criteria for Sportsmanship Awards

This GHSA Criteria may be used by any Region in selecting their winners, or they may use criteria already in place by their Region.

MOTION PASSED (voice vote)

TENNIS COMMITTEE: Report presented by Robert Douberly

The Committee recommended:

Change the format of post-season play to home matches for second and quarterfinal rounds (as had been done prior to 2005-06). The tennis calendar will be as follows:

Regular season ends April 21

First Round completed by Friday, April 27

Second Round completed by Wednesday, May 2

Quarterfinals completed by Tuesday, May 8

Semifinals and Finals played on May 11-12 at a neutral site

MOTION PASSED (voice vote) EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

Received as information:

Results of the survey of member schools concerning moving the tennis season, which was 2 to 1 to keep tennis in the Spring.

TRACK COMMITTEE: Report presented by Robert Davis

The Committee recommended:

In 2007 and 2008, the 4 x 800 meter relay will be a demonstration event at the region meets. All regions would report the participation numbers for the event using a special form. In 2008, the 4 x 800 meter relay would be a demonstration event at the State Track Meets. A form to collect participation data and criteria will be presented at the March meeting, 2007.

MOTION PASSED (voice vote)

Begin the first day of practice in Cross Country in 2007 on August 1.

MOTION PASSED (voice vote)

OLD BUSINESS

Second vote on the Constitutional changes as follows (changes are underlined):

Article 3, Section 3B:

Classification of public schools shall be based on F.T.E. (active enrollment) using the average of the counts of semester #2 and semester #3 of the preceding reclassification cycle secured from the Department of Education based on grades 9-12. ~~This count is based on figures from the nine (9) months immediately preceding reclassification.~~

Delete first existing NOTE and replace with: Classification for the school years 2008-09 and 2009-10 shall be based on the reports of spring semester 2007 and fall semester 2007. (Leave second existing NOTE.)

MOTION PASSED (voice vote)

Article 3, Section 3C:

Classification of private schools shall be based on enrollment information furnished by schools for grades 9-12 for the nine (9) months fall semester immediately preceding reclassification.

MOTION PASSED (voice vote)

NEW BUSINESS

Motion by Jesse Crews, second by Raynette Evans, to institute a fine of \$100.00 for each coach ejected from a GHSA contest (in addition to the sit-out rule).

MOTION PASSED (voice vote)

Motion was made and unanimously approved to adjourn.

GHSAs Officials / Coaches Clinics

By-Law #2.54, page 32 of the GHSAs Constitution and By-Laws states: Every coach at a GHSAs member school must attend a **GHSAs-sponsored rules clinic** if he/she coaches the following sports: football, softball, volleyball, riflery, cheerleading (spirit and/or competitive), basketball, wrestling, swimming and diving, track, baseball, soccer and gymnastics.

- (a) A \$50.00 fine per coach who does not attend a clinic will be assessed to the school.
 (b) First-year community coaches are reminded that clinic attendance is mandatory for them, also.
