Proposal for Selective/Nonselective Enrollment

- Schools must declare as Selective Enrollment if they use any of the processes listed to determine if a student is admitted to their school.
- 1) If a student requesting to attend your school is their school required to take an entrance exam to be admitted to
- 2) If the school has a review committee or person to admittance to their school evaluate the applying students application to determine

Selective Enrollment Schools

- If a school declares as Selective Enrollment they will have the following 2 choices.
- 1) They will go into the postseason with out of zone multipler. that is equally divided by their FTE count and schools only that are "Selective Enrollment." These schools will be divided into 2 Divisions

Selective Enrollment

- The second choice for "Selective Enrollment" Selective Enrollment" schools postseason tournament. schools is they may choose to use a 2.0 multiplier and then may compete in the "Non
