

Value of School-Based Athletics Worth the Problems

By the time this newsletter is fully distributed to all our member schools, corporate partners and other supporters of the Georgia High School Association, winter sports will have reached their conclusion for 2016.

We concluded Team Duals Wrestling in mid-January, Swimming and Diving in early February and the Traditional Wrestling Tournament in mid-February. Literally thousands of student athletes have competed in these championship events. Thousands of spectators have filled venues around the state to watch these events and to cheer on individual athletes and the schools and teams they represent.



Many more fans will have journeyed to the Centreplex in Macon to watch and cheer as another 30 schools compete for the State Championships in boys and girls Basketball. Again, hundreds of young people will be involved in these games – giving their all for their school in a quest for excellence.

Even more fans will observe the action via radio, video streaming and live television broadcasts. This is a time to celebrate high school athletics and their role in the educational process. These good things do not come easily. We can no longer assume high school athletics will continue just as they have been in the past. Important issues must be, and are being, addressed to insure that high school athletics will remain a stable force in the lives of millions of young people across the country.

Much attention is being paid to the health and safety of student athletes, and rightfully so! Risk management is the top priority in every sport played within the GHSA. The games are the safest they have ever been. Many rule changes and association policy changes focus on the safety of the athletes.

Economic pressures impact every aspect of school life – including sports and other competitive activities. Schools are working diligently to maximize resources and to find creative measures to finance their athletic programs.

These topics are but two issues confronting school-based athletics – there are others, as we might understand. We will be more likely to work through these problems if we are convinced of the great value of high school athletics as a part of the total educational framework. All of us must commit ourselves to the true purposes of school-based athletics while looking for ways to grow and develop our programs throughout Georgia.

DEADLINES FOR NOMINATIONS: The nomination deadline for submitting your students for Positive Athletes Georgia is March 15. For more information and nomination forms, please visit the web site or go to http://www.ghsa.net/sportsmanship.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE ITEMS: Anyone wishing to have an item included on the agenda for the spring State Executive Committee meeting must submit the item to the GHSA office by March 18, 2016. The spring State Executive Committee meeting will be held April 18, 2016 at the Marriott Macon City Center.

OPEN MEET DEADLINE: Member schools are reminded of the deadline to notify the GHSA of entry in Open Meet State Events such as Volleyball, Lacrosse, Class A Soccer, Wrestling, Riflery and Gymnastics for the school year 2016-2017. The deadline for notification in all those events is April 1, 2016.

SPRING CHEERLEADING TRYOUTS: Cheerleading practice/tryouts are limited to a maximum of 10 consecutive days per school between February 1 and the last day students are in school. Once tryouts are complete, no further practices may be held until school is out.

DEAD WEEK: The mandatory "Dead Week" for this year is Sunday, July 3, 2016 through Saturday, July 9, 2016.

The American Association of Adapted Sports Programs, Inc. (AAASP) will host the 19th Annual Interscholastic Wheelchair Basketball State Championship Tournament in Georgia, which will conclude March 4, 2016 with the finals in Macon.

The championship will be held in conjunction with the Georgia High School Association's State Tournament at the Macon Centreplex.

Feb. 27 - The AAASP Wheelchair Basketball JV Semifinals and Championships will be held at Aaron Cohn Middle School in Midland, GA. Game times: 11:00 a.m., 1:00 p.m., and 3:00 p.m. And the Varsity Semifinals, hosted by Gwinnett County Public Schools, will be held at Hull Middle School in Duluth at 11:00 a.m.

March 4 - The AAASP Wheelchair Basketball Varsity State Championship game will be held in conjunction with the GHSA boys' and girls' finals at the Macon Centerplex at noon. (The game will be shown on a delayed basis on March 5 at 9:00 a.m., on GPB.)

The Varsity championship was won last year by the Houston County Sharks, while the Junior Varsity title went to the West Georgia Wolverines.
