

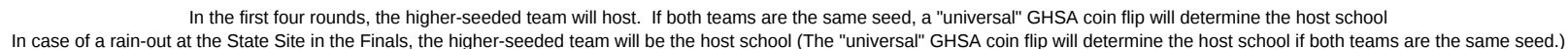
# 2023-2024 GHSA Class A Division I Boys State Tennis Championship
